The British Gordon Setter Club Puppy Buyers Guide

When looking to add a Gordon Setter to your family please think about where you buy and look to purchase from a reputable breeder.

- No deposit should be taken prior to puppy visit or prior to puppies being born.
- A breeder shall only breed from those Gordons that have been hip scored.
 Both parents tested for PRA(rcd4) (or genetically clear) and at least one
 parent is a 'clear' in the mating. Evidence of Health Tests to be provided to
 buyer.
- The dam should be at least 21 months when bred from and not have had a litter in the previous 12 months or be over 8 years old.
- Breeder not to have had more than 2 litters in previous 12 months/ calendar year - unless licensed - anyone breeding more than 3 (5 in Scotland) or more per year must be licensed.
- Puppies should be seen with the Dam.
- Puppies should not leave the breeder before the age of 8 weeks, come with a contract document, initial free insurance cover, microchipped and with puppy care guidelines.
- Breeders will provide Kennel Club registration documents along with a copy of pedigree.
- Breeders must sell puppies for a fair price, reflective of pedigree and quality.
- All reputable Breeders offer reasonable lifetime support to their puppy owners.
